



The Fabuloso Organ was made by sculptor and engineer Dave Cranmer and is operated by a collective known as Different Light, who are based at Spilsby Sessions House. It uses recycled parts from an old church organ that for many years had sat unused and neglected on the balcony of Spilsby Theatre.

Tim Murray-Browne, a visionary artist, engineer, and coder based in Glasgow, delves into the captivating intersections of Al, dance, and generative audiovisual art.

With accolades like the Sonic Arts Prize and a presence at prestigious venues like Tate Modern and the Victoria & Albert Museum, Tim's work is nothing short of groundbreaking.
